Pakistan floods appeal

Please donate to Christian Aid's Pakistan floods appeal.

Your donations will help make a difference to the people of Pakistan whose homes and livelihoods have been destroyed in what the UN is describing as the worst natural disaster since the 2004 Indian Ocean Tsunami.

According to Andrew Mitchell, Secretary of State for International Development, the Pakistan floods have affected an area the size of England. This gives an idea of the scale of this disaster and how important it is to respond and help people recover from this emergency - now and in the long term.

We have sent £150,000 to help Act Alliance partners respond to the devastating floods that have killed more than 1,400 people. Reports vary, but current estimates suggest that in excess of 20 million people in Pakistan have been affected.

ACT Alliance partners will provide food, shelter and medical assistance to in excess of 200,000 people in Balochistan, Khyber Paktunkwa, Punjab and Sindh provinces.

Monsoon rains sweep across Pakistan each year, but since 21st July the rains have been stronger and more intense than usual, causing the worst floods for 80 years. The extent of the damage is severe, and the floods have destroyed communities - demolishing entire villages, roads and bridges and ruining fields and crops and killing livestock.

Severe monsoon rains and flash-floods over the weekend of the 7th August caused further damage, destroying more towns and villages and adding to the death toll.

20 million people are thought to have been affected by serious flooding in Pakistan. People in the flood's wake were already desperately poor and what little possessions they had have been washed away. The extent of this crisis is only slowly emerging. The more villages that are reached the grimmer the picture becomes.

There is a desperate need for temporary shelter, clean drinking water and toilets to avert a public health catastrophe. People also need medical care and basic food items. We are looking at a sizable aid package that will require a great deal of public support.

With your help we can save lives:

£12 will buy one family hygiene kit - including soap, washing powder, sanitary cloths and towels, oral rehydration salts and nail-cutter/comb

£14 will buy one family household kit - including a plastic bucket, water cooler, floor mats, waste bin, shawls and water purification tablets

£46 will buy tools for clearing up - including a shovel, pick axe, bucket, broom and wheelbarrow.
