A 'Blue Plaque' is due to be unveiled on Friday 6th July at 42 Commercial St, Markinch, to mark what was the family home of the late Sir David Jack. He was the scientific brain behind the rise of the pharmaceuticals company Glaxo and was credited with the discovery of no fewer than seven highly important drugs. There will be light refreshments in the church hall starting at 4.30pm with a few short speeches from family and friends beginning at 5.00pm. It is hoped that there will be a small exhibition in the hall on the life and achievements of Sir David. The plaque will be unveiled at 42 Commercial St, at 6.00pm and the event and ceremony is open to anyone who is interested.
