#### A message from our Interim Moderator, Rev. Andrew Donald, Minister of Pathhead Parish Church in Kirkcaldy

Dear Friends

As many of you will know, the Revd. Carolann Erskine preached at Dunfermline: St. Ninian's on Sunday, 4th February 2018. Following the service, the congregation voted for Carolann to become its new minister and she accepted the call. Members of St. Ninian's who were not present at that service will get the opportunity to subscribe to the call and the Presbytery of Dunfermline will liaise with the Presbytery of Kirkcaldy. If the call to St. Ninian's is sustained by Dunfermline Presbytery, a date will be set for Carolann's Induction. It's next scheduled meeting is 15th February, so it is possible that an Induction could take place sometime in March.



Recognising that Carolann's ministry at Markinch and Thornton was relatively short - and without wishing to pass further comment - we offer Carolann our congratulations and pray that she may find fulfilment within Dunfermline Presbytery.

In the meantime, I have assured the Kirk Session that I wish to continue to serve as your Interim Moderator and I am sure we can move forward with a positive spirit. Markinch and Thornton Parish Church will move to the status of a Vacant Charge and the Presbytery, principally through the Vacancy Procedures Committee, will determine how we are to proceed.

I am conscious that this has been an uncertain time for members but there is now an opportunity to re-focus on the primary task of sharing the good news of the Gospel and serving the people of Markinch and Thornton to the best of our ability. As Interim Moderator, I am grateful to all those who are continuing to serve you well during this period of transition.

God's blessing to you as we journey to Easter and the joy it brings to us all.

#### Communion Services at Markinch and Thornton Church

At a recent session meeting, a small group of elders were asked to review the dates of the communion services for 2018. Rev Alistair McLeod was invited to join the discussion.

Historically, the church newsletters were distributed just prior to the date of the quarterly communion services, giving members, especially non-regular attendees, a timely reminder of the dates of the services. This was changed in 2016 but after much discussion the group recommended returning to regular quarterly communion services in February, May, August and November.

In addition to the regular communions it was discussed that because Easter and Advent have such importance in the Christian calendar, communion services should be held to celebrate these events, however it was decided that to avoid having two communions within a week or two of each other, the traditional late November communion should be held at the start of Advent.

Easter Communion (to be confirmed)

Sunday 20th May

Sunday 19th August

Sunday 2nd December (Advent)

Less formal communion services may be held on other dates and events, as decided by the ministry team.

#### Markinch Finally Put On The Map

The afternoon of 21st January 2018 saw nearly 80 people gather to hear local historian, geographer and author Bruce Manson give the first in three talks to highlight the forthcoming Fife Pilgrim Way.

The event, which took place at Markinch Church, was one of three promoted by Fife Coast and Countryside Trust, while local planning was by a three-way group representing the Markinch Heritage Group, the Markinch Community Council and the Parish Church. Attendees, who came from many locations up and down the route of the Pilgrim Way as well as locally, also admired a remarkable exhibition of knitted cameos of monks and pilgrims created by members of Culross



Abbey church, designed by their locum minister the Rev. Elizabeth Fisk, and seen also in the following three days by classes from Markinch Primary School as well as other visitors. Participants also had guided tours round Markinch's renowned twelfth century tower and its historic church.

Although the course of the route, to open later this year under the aegis of Fife Coast and Countryside Trust, was now fixed, the speaker had found many alternative routes in medieval times when travellers had to navigate their way round, or through, obstacles (like Auchmuty – the ford of the sheep) as they made their way from North Queensferry to St Andrews.











Among clues were the occurrence of 'spittal' in a name — indicating a hospice, or hospital, en route where pilgrims could find hospitality or care, but also maps and records from earliest times. A unique fourteenth century map, not yet full studied by scholars, had incorrectly shown the River Leven continuing through Fife to become the Kenly Water, which enters the sea at Boarhills. Not content with putting this right, the speaker also had ingeniously revealed, by close examination of the copyist's

pin holes, the meaning of a smudge somewhere in central Fife – which turned out to be a map symbol representing Markinch Church!

The event was greatly enhanced by a group of volunteers from the congregation (joined by a few others) who generously gave their time over a period of five days to provide hospitality, to look after the exhibition, and to make visitors welcome.

#### A Lifetime's Quest

A man is driving down the road and his car breaks down near a monastery. He goes up to the monastery, knocks on the door, and says, "My car has broken down. Do you think I could stay the night?". The monks graciously accept him, feed him dinner, even fix his car. As the man tries to fall asleep, he hears a strange sound. A sound unlike anything he's ever heard before. The Sirens that nearly seduced Odysseus into crashing his ship comes to mind. He doesn't sleep that night. He tosses and turns, trying to figure out what could possibly be making such a seductive sound. The next morning, he asks the monks what the sound was, but they say, "We can't tell you. You're not a monk".

Distraught, the man is forced to leave. Several years later, after never being able to forget that sound, the man goes back to the monastery and pleads for the answer again. The monks reply, "We can't tell you. You're not a monk". The man says, "If the only way I can find out what is making that beautiful sound is to become a monk, then please, make me a monk". The monks reply, "You must travel the earth and tell us how many blades of grass there are and the exact number of grains of sand. When you find these answers, you will have done what it takes to become a monk".

The man sets about his task. After many years of searching he returns as a grey-haired old man and knocks on the door of the monastery. A monk answers. He is taken before a gathering of all the monks. "In my quest to find what makes that beautiful sound, I travelled the earth and have found what you asked for: By design, the world is in a state of perpetual change. Only God knows what you ask. All a man can know is himself, and only then if he is honest and reflective and willing to strip away self-deception". The monks reply, "Congratulations, you have done what it takes to become a monk. We shall now show you the way to the mystery of the sacred sound".



Falling to his knees, he is utterly amazed to discover the source of that haunting and seductive sound.....but, of course, I can't tell you what it is because you're not a monk!




