A DIFFERENT WAY

As we work our way through the Gospel of Luke in the run up to Easter, a date that is, believe it or not, only eight Sundays away, I am finding myself challenged every week to think afresh about how I live my life. I find myself wondering what ways I can embrace the change that Jesus is calling for week after week, Bible reading after Bible reading. And then we arrive at this week's, and it is no less challenging.

In a nutshell we are told to love everyone, no matter who, what, or where they are. No qualifications, no exemptions.

On the surface this seems fairly straightforward. We might think, 'it is just the message of Christianity.' 'It is nothing new or innovative.' 'We have heard it all before.' We may have heard it so often, in fact, that we may not even take time to consider it. To think about it. To wrestle with the fact that it is an incredibly difficult, radical message that has real implications for how we live.

If we do take the time though, we will see that this is not a simple message, neither is it a straightforward one. It is a message that challenges each and every one of us, and the society and world around us. Because this is not how our world works.

Honestly, what would you do if someone slapped you on the cheek? Run away? Slap them back? Cry? Shout? All of these and more? Maybe. But who can honestly say they would simply turn their face and offer the other cheek to be slapped too? What would you do if someone picked your coat up and walked away with it? Run after them? Shout? Get angry? Maybe. But who could honestly say, 'not only would I let them have it, but I would also take off my shirt and give that to them too?'

In a sense then, the message, if not the content, of this week's story is not wildly different from last week's. Jesus enters into our world and turns it upside down. He recognises our human nature, understands it. But he also wants us to change. To think radically about how we live in this world, and how we use what we know of God, of Jesus, of the Holy Spirit to make it a better place.

So, this week my prayer is that we will each find the time to look for opportunities to act differently, radically, and find Jesus speaking into our lives for good and for change.
